## Telluride, Colorado Ski Week



### March 11-18, 2006

Save the date & start planning. Our 2006 week ski trip is to Telluride, Colorado a ski area with a 3500 ft. vertical and 309 inches of annual snowfall. It is a great experience for all levels of skiers. Shifting from east to west the mountain changes from expert to beginner terrain suitable for their skills. The East side provides Thigh Burners for experts, the middle provides Corduroy Cruisers for the Intermediates, and the West side offers gentle runs for the beginners.

Along the top ridge of the mountain (12255 ft) the Prospect Bowl addition of 2002 adds a diversity of terrain in an unparallel setting, from heart stopping steeps to friendly cruisers. It also includes a Beginners Park nestled at the bottom of a dramatic bowl with a breath-taking mountain backdrop.

Telluride is a historic mining town just eight blocks wide and 12 blocks long and peppered with color full Victorian homes and store fronts. Free transportation is provided within the town and a free Gondola ride connects the town over the ridge to the Mountain Village. The Gondola operates from 7 am to midnight and takes 13 minutes.

Trip includes RT bus from NH Shopping Center to Rochester, RT airfare Rochester to Montrose, CO, RT transfers from Montrose to Telluride, and a 5of 6 day lift ticket

We will be staying at The Telluride Lodge Condominiums located 200 yards from the Coonskin Lift. They are 2-bedrooms/2 bath/4-person units with fully equipped kitchens, fireplaces, indoor hot tubs, steam room, laundry facilities, on site grocery and more.
